of oxen one ten gallon pot one wheat sieve to him and his heirs or assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Featherstone two negroes
and their increase namely John, Sarah, to him and his heirs or assigns
forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto the wife of Thomas Walthall Decent
one negro woman Patti and her increase to be equally divided amongst

Alm. I give and bequeath unto the estate of Thomas Walthall two
one negro mares Patt and her Increase to be equally divided according
to his will to them and their heirs or assigns forever.

Alm. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Walthall one negro
Glen, one space mares, one best mare to her and her heirs or assigns forever.

Alm. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Phoebe Thackerstone five negroes
Will, Budy, Dapney, Inez, Hannah, one bay horse one ~~grey~~ filly one sheep
cattle one pair of flatt horns one Desk two trunks one parter Dish and all the
certain arises to her and her heirs or assigns forever.

Alm. I give and bequeath unto grandson Charles Thackerstone son of Henry
Thackerstone two negroes Fiddes and Tom, one round table to him and his
heirs or assigns forever.

Alm. I give and bequeath unto my five children Henry, Charles, Edward, Elizabeth,
and

Having all the contents of my estate of what nature or kind comes to them to be paid
Tendered to them without any fees, I have no appearance to be taken nor
no security to be taken of the executors. I have my two sons Henry, Nathaniel and
Edward Executors to this my last will this 13 Day of November 1778
