in perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and
testament in manner and form following.

Item I give to my loving wife Martha Walthall the use
of my plantation whereon I now live and my lands adjoining also the following
negroes, Gacey and Mary six head cattle one Feather bed and Furniture
and all my other household and kitchen Furniture except the beds
during her life and my horse and mare and at her death to return
as here after directed.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son Benjamin Walthall
one negroe due to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son Richard Walthall one negroe
due to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son Francis Walthall one negroe

and all my other household and kitchen Furniture except the beds
during her life and my horse and mare and at her death to return
as here after directed.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son Benjamin Wallhall
one negro slave to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son Richard Wallhall one negro
slave to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son Francis Wallhall one negro
slave and three head of cattle to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son Thomas Wallhall one
negro slave and four head cattle to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my son James Wallhall one
negro slave and four head cattle to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Martha Wallhall

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and I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Sarah
negro Harrier to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth
negro Toge to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my Daughter Jane Wallhall to my
Karl and Phyllis, and one feather bed and furniture to her her heirs and
assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Ann Wallhall one my
Kut and a feather bed and furniture to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Wallhall
one negro Lucy and a feather bed and furniture also another
small negro called Toge a girl to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give the use of my plantation whereon I now live and live

small negro called Tige a girl to her her heirs and assigns forever
I give the use of my plantation whereon I now live and land
adjoining after my wife's death to my four daughters Martha, Jane
Ann and Winifred and for the said four daughters to hold the
said land untill they shall be married but when either of them mar-
ries to have no longer right and that the land be held by my said four
daughters untill such time as they shall be married.

I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Wallhall at my
wife's death a negro man Lacey to him his heirs and assigns forever.

I give devise and bequeath to my loving wife Martha
Wallhall the wench Lacy already mentioned to her and the
sole disposal of her at her death also all the household and
kitchen furniture.

Thank you the house man and wife that I have hereby publicly
legally decided amongst the said four daughters Mary wife of
and I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Benjamin Hall
and Francis Hall executors of this my last will and testament
working and making null and void all and every other will and wills
formerly made by me in testimony, I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this 13th day of July 1770.
