Know all men by these presents that I, John Sampson, Lieutenant Colonel in the Regiment of Light Dragoons
commanded by Col. David Blane Junr. came before me & made oath that on the 16th Day of
August last past Lieutenant William Washburn a native of ^{the} Chatham County, in the State
of Virginia, ^{when an Officer of the said Regiment} received a mortal Wound in an Engagement with the Enemy in the State
of Georgia of which Wound he died on the 12th Day of the same Month But before his
Death & at the House where he died he disposed of his Estate verbally in the following
manner That is to say he directed that all his Estate except his clothes might go to
his brother Richard if he returned from Sea but if he did not return then ^{he} directed that his

manner That is to say he directed that all his Estate except his Cloaths might go to
his brother Richard if he returned from Sea but if he did not return then ^{he} directed that his
House & Money & Cloaths should be given up to his Friend & Companion Cornet James
of the same Regiment & his whole Estate of every kind in Virginia except the Cloaths
House & Money he gave to his Wife Peter Talbot of Chesterfield County in Virginia
that he requested this Deponent to take a Note of this disposition of his Estate
I have the same carried into Execution as far as he could in consequence ^{of which} he delivered
the Cloaths House & Money to Cornet James & has attested this disposition of the
same at the Deponent's request having stipulated with the said ^{James} for the return
of the above mentioned Effects the Cloaths excepted in case of the return of Richard
