Chesterfield County, Virginia, Wills 1755 to 1800
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In the name of God Amen I Charles Barber of the county of
Charlottesville being of perfect memory do think proper to make and ordain this my
to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. That is to say
I give to my brothers John and William Barber all my landed estate to be
equally divided between them and to them and theirs forever.

My Negro boy known by the name of Skip I give to John Gibson my nephew
and son of William Gibson to him and his heirs forever. My negro girl Eve
and my mare I give to my sister Sally Barber and to her heirs forever. But in
case of her death without an heir from her body it is my wish and desire
that the said Negro Girl Eve should in that case be the property of my brother
Charles Barber to him and his heirs forever my bed furniture and cloth I give
to my Nephew Samuel Hardin Parkey to him and his heirs forever. My gun
and gun I give to my brother Charles Barber to him and his heirs forever.

In Order to ^{have} make this my above Will a above mentioned covered into Execution

I do hereby constitute and appoint my fellow John Barton and my friend
 Stephen Pendergast junior to be Executors to this my last Will and Testament
 to which I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the eighth
 January in the year of Christ One thousand seven hundred and Eighty Eight
