I give and bequeath to my two daughters Jilly and Mary Ann all my land

I now hold

them I give and bequeath to my daughter Jolly the lower part of my land with the plantation on which I now live bounded by the line of my son Henry to her and hers forever

them I give and bequeath to my daughter Maryann my lands above my son Henrys line which lands I give to her and her heirs forever likewise one feather Bed and furniture one cow and calf at the time of her marriage my desire that my wife should have the use of my household goods and stock not yet mentioned her lifetime likewise the use of my negro Bob her lifetime and at the death of my wife I desire my household goods and stock be equally divided between my two daughters Jolly (and Maryann My son Henry having had his part of my household goods and stock in my

lifetime and of my daughter ^{the} Maryann ~~successor~~ ^{legacy} mentions
to her before the death of my wife I desire fully may have the same
value out of my estate before the division of the whole and I desire my
negro Bob may be sold to the highest Bidder of my three children

fully Maryann and Henry the money thence arising to be equally
divided between the three and I desire my estate may not be appraised

otherwise desire that if either of my children die without an heir that
their part of my estate be equally divided between the other two and
