after her mother's death to her and her heirs forever

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I likewise give to my son William Norris one bed and furniture to him
and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Jane Norris one bed and furniture
to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Luc Norris one bed and furniture
after her mothers death to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto Sarah Rutledge one cow to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Norris one gray horse
to her during her life and after the death of my wife my will and

desire is that my daughter Luc Norris should have the said horse

and all the remainder of my stock I leave to my beloved wife and
all the remainder of my estate not before devised to be equally divided
between my wife and three children
