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In the name of God Amen I John Hill of Chesterfield County being
in my perfect Senses Mind and Memory. pruned by God do give
and dispose of all my worldly Goods in Manner & Term following
I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Ann Hill my Negroes
Belly Sarah &c & James and likewise a Bay Mare and Saddle &
all my House Hold Goods & Personal Estate to be equally divided
amongst my Wife & two Children.
I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Polly Hill one Negro Girl
named Pat and a Martin and Billy and one Horse and Saddle
I give and bequeath unto my son Richard Hill one Negro Girl
named Lillian and Jimmy and Mares and all my Land that
I possess. If both of my Children should die without an Heir
my Wife Ann Hill shall have half of my Estate and the other
half to my sister & James Robertsons Children and my Lawful
Debt must be paid of my Estate - and also do appoint

George Churchman, Clerk of the Court, and my wife Anne
 witnesses to my last will and testament. We all left my house
 where I have heretofore set my hand and affixed my seal
 this tenth day of February in the year of our Lord Christ
 one thousand seven and eighty-nine.
