being sick of Body but of perfect mind & memory do make & seal  
this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following Testy I give  
my Heart for the sole benefit <sup>of</sup> my beloved wife

My wife the upper part of the west of land I am to own by a  
deed being here containing Ten and one bush including the meadow  
known as the plantation whereon John Cox with Timber first had and  
paid duty to support the same among his Cope also the meadow  
of four acres to Mr. Bob. Drake. A negotiation with him  
and Hanes' attempt for buying a tract twenty acres of land  
the tract of Hanes belonging to Hanes' plantation with a  
part of my House- Hold furniture & Kitchen utensils such  
shall have to be by her payment for her use during her life & after  
her decease to be owned as it may be decided.

Item. I give and devise unto my son James Frith all of my  
right, title, interest and claim I have with a man named Edward

Item. give & devise unto my son James two hundred pounds  
more his pigmy son named Tom with a Horse bridle & saddle  
Together with a Bed & Furniture now in his custody taken to  
his Husb & wife's place.

Item I give & devise unto my son John one tract or parcel of Land  
containing two hundred & forty acres situate in Spring Creek  
in Prince George County above the Negro's Hole design-

Dated Tom too bound below a House to go & build there

Feather Bed & Furniture to him to be paid off for his

Item I give & bequeath unto my son William two hundred acres  
of Land in the same County to include the upper part  
of the tract I purchased of my son James above Negro's

From I give unto my son Edward the upper part of Land I have  
given you & your wife among the rest of the land  
from the river to bounded by the river &  
the plantation of his brother John of which he  
has a plantation to the left of mine & the  
upper part of the land I have given you &  
your wife among the rest of the land  
In I give unto my son Edward the upper part of Land I have  
given you & your wife among the rest of the land  
the rest of falling back in this County containing about hundred  
Acres including the plantation William Hargrave & my  
Negroes Stock Farm with a bed & Furniture now belonging  
to him & to his Heirs & his wife & his wife's  
& bequests

From I give unto my son Stephen the lower part of the same Land

to have & to bid the world a final farewell

Henry I give unto my son Stephen the lower part of the town of Landes  
lire or below the quay to branch likewise one hundred & twenty acres

I purchase of Richard Dickenson adjoining the same also Major

John, Col. of the Huz. & his son John of the same name

Dick with a further Brick Furnace. These houses stand on land  
his Run about 1200 ft.

Henry I give & bequeath unto my son Samuel that first mentioned in  
my favor of Land that I have left for the use of his children to be enjoyed  
by him at the arrival of his Heir his Twentieth of my wife. "God  
or his trustees for him may make such compensation in the said  
Land for any encumbrance they shall think fit not interfering with

To My dear Friend on the same Occasion also a Present  
consisting of a Table Bed & Furniture to his wife  
Anne & Sons present

I now give for her use & Maintenance of my Daugher Anne  
for during her Lifetime Negro named Billie & Will  
and at her death to the Use of her Daugher Margaret  
no such Chair or Bed than she used slaves with their wives  
if any shall deserve equally to be divided among them  
Sofas & their Chairs & Furniture from her Daugher given  
Also to my said Daughter Margarita I give a Chair bed  
Chair a Table Bed & Furniture

Item I give by her to my Daugher Anne a Table Bed  
& Furniture Also Bridle & saddle

I have yealded & given to my Daughter Jane in Trust his estate  
to Distribute His Estate between

b. Furniture His Bed & bedding

I do leave for the use benefit Maintenance of my said Daughter  
Jane during her life ten Pounds To Will, just Hannah &  
a boy called Scott & of my said Daughter Jane two Pounds  
from her Body then I give the before mentioned Scott a year  
Hannah & Matt & their increase if any is to divide & posses  
their Heirloom. If no I give them the said Pounds with their  
increase if any shall ascend & equally to be divided among  
my other Daughters & their issue.

Item I leave for the use benefit & maintenance of my Daughter  
Jane for the rest of her life ten Pounds To Will, just Temple

I wish to set her at ease I give her a simple legacy with an increase of  
take off one of my said daughters Mary & her three friends if no friend  
comes to her she said Mary's children & her three friends to be divided  
I then gave unto her wife Mary my trusty & true Friend Mrs Anna Maria

Some slaves for the said long & maintenance of my daughter Martha  
during her life two Negroes Tom & Neddy to be at her disposal  
I give the said slaves with their increase if any to the wife of the  
said Martha & their three friends, if no friend then the said slaves  
All other wise with their increase if any shall descend to be equally  
divided amongst my other daughters & their spouses forever.

I give to said Martha and her husband & family a house built by

I give her said Martha my true Bridle & Saddle & one Leather Breast

Jenny Hill & gives her husband Mr. McDonald to my wife Johanna  
Anatia Agnes I will settle with them in case from this date

at the death of my said wife shall be equally divided between my  
children only herunder mentioned, To Mr. Daniel Elizabek  
Judith Susannah & the issue of their bodies forever provided

Nevertheless that at any time, the above mentioned children  
shall Mary or where to lawfull ago my executors shall at their  
directions send her said Child or Children with any slaves or slaves  
as they shall appear to be equitable the said Child or Children  
returning with them or stand at the decease of their M. they

After return they were back to the old Earth except that an  
equal Division may be made between Son & daughter  
Anne Clemons and my Daug'ter Susannah the sum of pounds twenty  
Money out of my estate & bring the legacy given to her by her  
youth Father John James Dufresne which I have received &  
I appoint and nominate James Dufresne my Wife  
Brother of son William Fabius & wife Watkins Esq.  
of his my last Will & Testament & desire that there may be  
no enforcement taken in my estate in Westmoreland  
There to wait to set my hand & affixed my seal the 29<sup>th</sup>  
Year above written
