In the name of God Amen June 15. 1765. I John Tild of the county of
chester and parish of date being at this time of sound mind and perfect
memory though weak in body do make and publish this to be my last
will and testament in manner and form and following
I give and bequeath to my son John Tild one tract of land lying and
being in the county of cheshire and bounded as follows that is to

my having at the kings corner from thence an east course to the
fork of the parummon run proceeding along the said run to the
and along the said road to the main branch of the parummon
down the said run to the kings corner to him and the heirs law
legotten of his body forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Valentine one tract or parcel
of land lying and in the county aforesaid and bounded as fol
that is to say beginning at the main fork of Tinsbury from the
along Randolphs line to the rocky run proceeding up the said
run to the head and from thence an east course to the fork of
Tinsbury where it began to him and the heirs lawfully begotten
of his body forever. But my will and meaning is that my wife
Ann Vest should have the full and free use of the said place
or and during the time of her widowhood. I likewise give to
son Valentine a negro man named Robin taken and

Ann Test should have the full and free use of the said plantation
or and during the time of her widowhood I likewise give to
son Valentine a negro man named Robin to him and his
forever with this proviso that my wife Ann Test shall be
entitled to the use of the said negro during her widowhood
likewise give to my son Valentine a horse and mare with
intention that my wife aforesaid shall have the use of them
during her widowhood. I likewise leave to my son Valentine
of my beds. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth
a bed and furniture. I give and bequeath to my son James
Test one tract of land lying and being in county aforesaid
and beginning at the upper fork of Tinsbury proceeding
along Tinsbury to Chatham's line along the said line
head line and from thence as it runs west course to my

Valentine's line to them and to the heirs lawfully begotten of his body
forever. I give and bequeath to my sons Philip Ket and William
Arnwell Ket one tract of land lying and being the county aforesaid
and beginning at the rocky run where Randolph's line joins the said
proceeding along Randolph's line to a corner given at the mouth of
passummon run from thence to the Kings corner where my son John's line
begins and from the said corner up the passummon run to my son
Valentine's line to them and the heirs lawfully begotten of their
body forever.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Ket and my son George
Ket one tract of land lying and being in the county aforesaid and
beginning at the main passummon run where my son John's line
joins the said run and proceeding thence in a north east by east course
to a long branch that comes from the same

beginning at the main parsimonon run where my son John line
John the said run and proceeding thence in a north east by east course
to a long branch that joins from the pincy branch and a long the east
side of the said branch to main pincy branch and along the pincy
to its source and from thence to Daniel Kunklus line so along the
said line to my son James line along my son James line to my
son Silentius line I give the above remained tract of land to be equally
divided between my daughter Elizabeth and my son George
and then to descend to their lawfully begotten or their body forever
and I hereby nominate and appoint my sons John and James
Test executors of this my last will and testament. In Witness
