

Wicham, Richard was present and agreed that the articles
for which no vouchers were given in more Just and that the
ballance of two hundred and five pounds and three pence
appears to be due from the estate of George Wicham Decided
to the said children given under my hand this 5th day of
March 1772 George Robinson

In the name of God amen, I John Wicham of the parish of
St. Luke and county of Chesterfield, being of perfect mind and memory
thanks to God, do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament in manner and force following.

Imprimis I give the use of my negroe man Tom to my loving
wife during her widowhood, also I give the use of my negroe
woman Sally to my said wife during her natural life

Item I give and devise to my daughter Wicham my plantation

of land between same more or less to him and his heirs forever.
Allm I give and devise to my son William Wisham the share
of the one half of my land in Amelia county adjoining the land
belonging to my brother William Wisham's estate and his heirs
forever.

Allm I give and devise to my son Thomas Wisham the other
half of my said land in Amelia county adjoining the lands of
my brother William Wisham's estate. my will is that if either
my two sons William or Thomas should die before they come to
the age of twenty one years or married, that then the survivors of the two
should enjoy the hole of the said lands to them and their heirs forever.

Allm my will and desire is that if my Executors hereafter named
thinks proper that then they may dispose of all my meadows or
tenement lying and being in between a hundred town. Chesterfield county

All my will and desire is that if my Executors hereafter named
thinks proper that then they may dispose of all my messuage or
tenement lying and being in Bermuda hundred town, Chestfield in
containing all my lands in the said town or such other of my
personal estate not yet given away as they shall think proper
in order to pay all my Just debts

All my will is that if my Executors hereafter named do not think
proper to sell my messuage or tenement in Bermuda hundred
town that then I give the same lands and Tenements to my son
Henry Worshearn to him and his heirs forever. my will further is
that if my Executors should sell my lands in Bermuda hundred
town in order to pay my Just debts that then I give to my son Henry
Worshearn two negroes viz Lewis and Sarah to him and his heirs
forever.

that my will and desire is that all my estate and goods
should be equally divided between all my children who
shall attain to the age of Twentyone years to them and their
heirs forever.

And my will and desire is that my estate should not be inven-
tured nor appraised. I hereby do make and ordain this my last
will and Testament revoking all other wills by me made. I also
constitute and appoint William Giles and Thomas Worsham my
and sole executors of this my last will and Testament. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 2th of
May one thousand seven hundred and sixty nine.
