case of the Death of either of my two Nephews John & William aforesaid
before they arrive to the Age of twenty one years
Then I assure the Survivors may have their Share of my Estate taken & their
Heirs forever

It is my will & desire that my Brother John Archer should have the use of my
Negroes Tom & Jane untill my Nephew John Archer arrives to the Age of twenty
one years & no longer

It is my will & desire that my Brother John Arthur should have the use of my
Vegrow Tom & Jane untill my Nephew John Arthur arrives to the Age of twenty
one years & no longer

I constitute & appoint my Brother John, ticher & my Friend William
Green Executors of this my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal this tenth Day of April one thousand seven
hundred & seventy six
