third of all I possess. Moosabes to him & his Heirs forever

Item I give to my Son & his Heirs & to the other half of the remainder of my Land  
adjoining my brother Hamblin's land a Negro Man named Tally who  
Young. Here to third part of all my Household Furniture Cattle Hogs & Sheep  
Plantation Wm sible. to him & his Heirs forever

Item I give to my Daughter Lucy like one third of all my Household Furniture  
Cattle Hogs & Sheep to her & her Heirs forever

Item I give the use of all that part of my Estate their I have given to my Son  
black but my house to my living Wife & the belonging to me & her life

And lastly I do appoint my Son & his Heirs my Executor to my Estate
