part of all my cattle Hogs & Sheep my Household Furniture to him and
third of all Ispoke^d Moveables to him & his Heirs forever

Item I give to my son Charles & to the other half of the remainder of my son
adjoining my brother Thomas Duff Junr & a Negro Man named Jacob my other
Young Niece & a third part of all my Household Furniture cattle Hogs & Sheep
Plantations Wensilake to him & his Heirs forever

Item I give to my Daughter Lucy & to one third of all my Household Furniture
cattle Hogs & Sheep to her & her Heirs forever

Item I give the use of all that part of my Estate that I have given to my son
Charles & to my house to my loving Wife & to her during her natural life
