Item I give & bequeath unto my son Percival Dance twenty five Pounds
to be paid of my Estate after my Decease by my Executors to him his Heirs & Assigns
forever

Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Pusey one Shilling to her Heirs & Assigns forever

to be paid of my Estate after my Decease by my Executors to him his Heirs & Assigns for
Henry Jones & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Davis five Shillings to have & hold
I have given unto my loving Wife Mary Dancer four Negroes named Adam, Bay, &
Belmont & also all the rest of my Estate not yet disposed of during of her natural life
and after her Decease to my Daughter Agnes Dancer to have & her Heirs & Assigns
forever

Lastly I do constitute & appoint my two sons Edward & William Dancer to be
my Executors & my beloved Wife Mary Dancer ^{my} Executrix of this my last Will & Testa-
ment hereby revoking all Wills heretofore made by me either by Word or Deed confirming
this & no other to be my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & affixed my seal this fifteenth day of Sept. in the year of our
one thousand seven hundred & eighty three
