Acres to him & his Heirs forever my Will is that my beloved Wife shall have full

I give unto my daughter Martha three Dishes six Plates one bond & half one Iron
& five or ten shillings in each one feather Bed & Furniture

All the remainder of my Estate not given away I give to my beloved Wife during
her natural life or widowhood & after her Death to my son Francis & his Heirs forever

My Will is that my Estate shall ^{not} be appraised

I appoint my son Thomas & my loving Wife Executors of this my last Will & Testament
working & accumulating all Will ^{whereof} I have made In Witness whereunto I set my

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hand & affixed my seal this Day of in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred

by Pigs or ten Buller's in back one feather Bed & Furniture
