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Also I give and bequeath unto my son Peter Gill at the death or marriage of his mother Mary Gill all the remaining part of my land and when of the age of twenty one and his mother shall living be married then to be in possession of the said Tract of land except the plantation and so much land as may be allotted there for the support of the same as mentioned above to her and also one third of my personal estate to him his heirs and assigns forever

Also I lend unto my mother Susanne Gill a negro woman named Annaka and at her death to return to my children as above Also I do constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary Gill and my kinsmen and friends John Lane and Edward Gill my Executors and Executors of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the Twenty fourth day of Sept. 1787
