of
Eliza Browne
Dec 7

In the Name of God Amen. I Eliza Browne of Santa Fe County N.M. being of sound mind
though old and weak, and desiring to make this my Last Will & Testament according
to the Form of Law. I give & bequeath to my child Fanny Browne all my Estate on this Land to be her
in use & to do with as she may think proper, to have my Servants Gilbert & Hannah & all their Chil-
dren also Ralph & all her Children, & also all my Part of my Brother John Browne's Estate in-
cluding Negroes, Stock, Household Furniture, Bonds &c. & also all my Part of the Estate of David Par-
sons including Negroes, Bonds, Plate &c.

I will and bequeath to my children Sally Adams and Emily Johnston an equal Division of the Money
then respective Husband or now owe me, as I know not the exact Amount. I wish to equal inclusion
they paying to Ann Morgan Johnston Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars each to be paid to her Mo-
ther or First of her Children to her Valued from my Death, and in the Event same I wish
should not live to be Twenty One years old, then to belong to her Mother.

I also give and bequeath to my child Nancy Wife of Morgan Johnston a Negro Girl by
Name Ellen. I also desire my child Fanny to pay to William Mitchell one Hundred Dollars
in a Month of October for his Widow's allowance to us in all the afflictions of our Family.
I further desire my child Fanny in view of the above bequeathments to her to pay Three
Hundred and Fifty Dollars to the Children of my Sister Sally Adams to be equally divided among
them - and also pay to the Children of my Sister Emily Johnston Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars
to be equally divided among them. The above to be paid soon as convenient to my child Fanny when
she can do it without embarrassing herself.

I can do it without hurting my hand.
 To the above I add my Stamp & Seal the 10th Day of September in the year of our Lord
 1847.
