I Robert P. Page of the County of Clarke and State of Virginia do make and
publish this my last Will & Testament.

I give to my wife Susan for her life the farm upon which I have been
dwelling the 400 acres rec'd by me from my Father being all the land I have which
lies upon the south side of the road leading to the place where I have been
at her death it is my will that the same farm shall be equally divided among
my children by her in the event of the death of one or more of the said children during
their Mother's life without leaving a child or children the said land is to go to the
Survivors of them I have the land on the other side of the road purchased by

negroes. I hereby assign my own negroes by my first marriage, & of which I have
do without the same & without having disposal of the same by will or otherwise, I direct
that the survivors survivors shall inherit from her - under a conveyance for my wife made
to the late Mr. Francis of Philadelphia, my said three daughters are to receive among them
at my death all money & other property in Pennsylvania which I rec^d from the estate of the
late Francis in right of my first wife - some of it has been sold & the proceeds given to my
said three daughters. I hereby confirm the said conveyance, & I give in addition
to their share plate ware and all articles of furniture in my house rec^d from their
grandmother the late Mrs. Francis.

By a like conveyance made to Nathl. Burwell but after my second marriage I gave
to my present wife all the property I rec^d with her which I should hold at my death
I either provide or intend to provide that she should have the benefit of any property
which I might sell under purchase with the proceeds of any part of the said property
I might sell - I have sold several of her negroes, & some of the money arising from
such sales was applied in part payment of the land given hereby to my three eldest
daughters. I have also rec^d several sums of money in her right from the estate of Col.
N. Burwell as an equivalent for the property thus sold -

I give to my said wife all my house hold & kitchen furniture except the articles rec^d
as above mentioned from Mrs. Francis & whatever else may have been rec^d with
my first wife. I also give her all the stock & farming utensils upon the estate
including carriage and horses & one third part of all Bank Stock & bond or
other debts due to me after payment of my debts & funeral expenses.

I also give her Mr. John Southan's bond which is for the purchase money of
the Millwood Mill & negro Phill. Lemmon - the Mill was her property
before marriage, & Phill was bought in exchange for one of her negroes sold as

She will have under the conveyance above mentioned all the negroes & red with
her or their increase, except such as I have sold, & as they are numerous & valuable
I do not give her as dower, any of the negroes not rec^d in her right of which I may
be possessed. It is my Will that all the property of which I am or may be
possessed at my death not disposed of in the foregoing part of this Will be equal-
ly divided among all my children & the heirs of those whom I may survive—
I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife Susan N Page, & my brother John E
Page the executors & executor of this will, & I desire & direct that no security
be required, of them or either of them.
