The Last Will & Testament Robert Page Esq. Dec.

In the Name of God I Robert Page of Sanville in the County of Tioga and
State of Virginia being in good Health and in full possession of my mental Powers, with a
View to provide for an Event which happens to all Men here do hereby make and
constitute this as my Last Will and Testament.

My wishes: I direct that my Body may be buried in a plain Sylex and placed in
my Family Burial Ground, and with Respect to my Soul I pray that the great and
good Father of my Being thus the Merits and Intercession of my great and good Re-
deemer may pardon all my sins of Commission and Omission of which I heartily repent
and that I may be purified and justified it may be a blessing among the Saints in Light
and to the enjoyment of everlasting Happiness.

Witness my hand and seal to my dear beloved Wife during her Life my Sanville

Term of Three Hundred Acres at the River of Ulsterland by right of the same including
my One and my Negroes House and to contain twenty three Acres and so much of my Land
North of my Stake as will make for me Four Hundred Acres in all to include what has
been called the West House field. I give her also my furniture and four or five horses to join
to my House hold Furniture and two Negroes also for her Life including my folk and my
Servants and such others as my Will may direct for her of the Effectives.

Item - I give to my dear Son John Page Junr and his Wife Anne Four Hundred Acres of Land
including the two Hundred Acres already conveyed to him out of Ulsterland and Four Acres
East of One Hundred Acres on which two Hundred Acres are now enclosed by placing
his South Fence to James Line at the Land and running thence North by bearing of a
Quarter Turn and thence with my Line and Quarter South and West Lines as to make up
One Hundred Acres more which will make in all for him Four Hundred Acres. I
release to him any Debt and Accounts which he may owe me.

Item - I give all the Residue of my Estate Real and Personal including the Reversion of
my Laneville Farm to my Executors hereafter named as a Fund for the Payment of my
Debts in the first Place and the Residue after Payment of my Debts I give to be divided in
such manner as to give the full one of my dear daughter Jane her one Half of said one
= dce and the other Half to my dear daughter Mary and William for her life and if
her husband dies to her heirs.

Item - I give to my Grandson John Mathewson my Law Books provided he enters
upon the study of the Law and in the Event of his not pursuing that Profession then
give the said Library to such other of my Grandsons who shall make the Vow of the
Law his Profession.

Item - I hereby constitute my dear Son John Page Junr and my dear Son in Law
John W. Page and Joseph W. Williamson my Executors.

 two were sworn and severally deposed that they were well acquainted with the Testator Page
 writing and ever believed the said Writing at the same time thereto subscribed to be wholly written
 by the Testator own hand. Whereupon the said Writing is ordered to be read and the same last
 Will and Testament of the said Robert Page Esq read. And on the Motion of Joseph A
 Williamson one of the Clerks in the said Will named the two Executors in the said Will
 name having pronounced in open Court to grant of as such which is ordered to be entered into
 the Court and together with the said Will and Testament by him shown in Court for
 this special Purpose John Page Esq and John A Page Esq Solicitors entered into an agreement
 before the Deputy of the County of Lancashire on the 11th day of January 1841
 before the said Joseph A Williamson Esq one of the Clerks in the said Court for the

Williamson one of the Executors named therein and there being no subscribing Witnesses thereto James W. Harrison David M. Porter & William D. Wiggan two were sworn and severally deposed that they were well acquainted with the Testator. Having writing and every way believes the said Writing an the same thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the Testator own Hand. Whereupon the said Writing is read to be the same as the true last Will and Testament of the said Robert Page Esq^r Deceased. And on the Motion of Joseph A. Williamson one of the Executors in the said Will the name of the other two Executors in the said Will name having renounced in open Court to qualify as such which is on record to be certified who may be taken together with David M. Porter by his Attorney in fact for this special Purpose John Page Esq^r and John M. Page his daughter entered into an agreement to pay to the said Joseph A. Williamson the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars in addition to the said sum directed by the said Will to be paid to the said Joseph A. Williamson Executor as a reward for obtaining the said Will in due form.
