

The Last Will & Testament of Rudolph Howell Dec^r

Written on the Month of
August 1841.

In the Name of God Amen I Rudolph Howell of the County of Kent in the
State of Virginia being of sound disposing Mind and Memory in Law enquiring and conscious of
sinking at this untimely Manner so far as I am able before I die do hereby make publish and
declare this to be my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills and Testaments
heretofore made by me. I bequeath unto the first Person or Persons living at the time of my
Death having the name of Shall within a reasonable Time after my decease sell and make
Sale of all my Personal Property and out of the Proceeds thereof satisfy and pay off all my just
Debts and funeral Expenses excepting a certain Debt which I am owing to John F Smith of the Town
of Smithfield which said Debt is secured by a Deed of Trust on my Real Estate and
that the Persons if any they are to divide in equal Portions between my four Sons to wit Henry
George William and Joseph Howell in their Heirs.

Then unto my Son Joseph Howell and his Heirs I do hereby give and bequeath the
whole of my Personal Property which I do hereby bequeath the entire of my Real Estate subject nevertheless
to the Payment of the following specific bequest of Money that is to say in full satisfaction of my former
loan the whole of my Real Estate to my Son Joseph in the full Power to satisfy and pay off the whole
amount of the debt mentioned aforesaid as being due to John F Smith by reason of Trust Estate
himself and Smith aforesaid and then unto my Son William the further Sum of Eight Hundred
and thirty seven Dollars and fifty cents and in full of his Death to his Heirs To my Son Henry the
Sum of Four Hundred and fifty three Dollars and seventy five cents and in full of his Death to
his Heirs Unto my Son George the further Sum of Two Hundred and fifty three Dollars and
seventy five cents and to Mary Ann Lock Widow of Franklin Lock deceased the further Sum of
Two Hundred and fifty three Dollars and seventy five cents and in full of her Death to her Heirs
I reserve several Sums of Money aforesaid to be paid by my Executors to the said Legatee aforesaid

and the whole of my ~~last~~ ^{will} ~~and~~ ^{and} my Son Joseph in the first Place to satisfy and pay off the whole
amount of the debts mentioned & for as being due to John F Smith by lease of said
business debts & for as being due to my Son William the further sum of Eight hundred
and thirty seven Dollars and fifty cents and in case of his death to his Heirs To my Son Henry the
sum of Four hundred and fifty three dollars and seventy five cents and in case of his death to
his Heirs And my Son Joseph his Heirs the sum of Two hundred and fifty three dollars and
seventy five cents and to Mary Ann Lock Widow of Frank Lock according the further sum of
Two hundred and fifty three dollars and seventy five cents and in case of her death to her Heirs

The sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars to be paid by Installments to the said Legatee a sum
in the following manner and at the following dates and the said sum shall be paid in full
within five years of the date of my death to the Legatee aforesaid and shall be paid in full
within five years of my death And the said sum in less years from the date of my decease and
the remaining time within five years from the date of my death without interest except
from the time when each separate installment shall fall due and be unpaid.

Then in the next Place unto the Heirs of my last deceased Son George Smith and when Heirs
I desire by will and bequest the sum of two Dollars to be equally divided between them which
I mention in case to show that they have not been forgotten and I have by mistake or in error made
this my last will and Testament I having been at considerable cost of time and money in
making it. And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Son Joseph Heirs aforesaid
and my Brother George M. Hunt Executors of this my last will and Testament with full Powers
to carry out Effect the same hereby declaring that the said sum shall not require to be paid in full

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my seal this 14th Day
of July A.D. 1861 and being duly sworn.
