In the Name of God Amen I Thomas T. Byrd of the County of Flunka and
State of Virginia do hereby make this my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking all
Wills heretofore made by me.

I wish that my Man Gabriel shall be free from the Burse of my Death and that he
shall be paid out of my Estate the Sum of Two Hundred Dollars as soon as my Executor
or assignee can conveniently pay it.

I will that the two Children of Ann Preston Thomas Whiting called Finkle and
Maria Louisa shall be put into the Charge of Sam. Wyman Jr one his Wife Mary
who is my Niece of the City of Baltimore to be under their tuition without any charge
except their Support until they shall attain the Age of Twenty five Years respectively
when they shall be entitled to their Share but it is intended that they shall retain
them in their Education until the expiration of the said term, and not sell or alienate their Right
to them or either of them to any other Person whatever, but such Alienation shall be void
they shall be each entitled to their Share respectively immediately upon such their
action.

I will and assign to the said Children of the said Ann Preston the Mother of
said Finkle and Maria Louisa and to her said Son my Nephew Sam. Preston the Mother of

I have in charge with my Sister Maria the Wife of D. N. Nichols of Newbury
and to her I want to be annexed equally between them at her death all my Estate & every
description of my property as a bond charging the same with the Payment of my just debts
& the Legacy to Gabriel above mentioned.

I make this Request to my Sister Maria from a sense of Obligation to her & all
Kinsmen & Friends and from no want of Affection for my Brothers and other Families
I appoint my Brother Richard ^{Esq} & the Parents of this my last Will requir-
ing that no Security may be required of them beyond his own Home.

It is my Intention that my Sister Maria should have the entire Use of my Property
left to her self & pursue a single Life.

having obtained Debt from Wilson and Firm.
