Huffman & Shilman to be laid off to him hereafter of a Bay fielding.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son John. Matthews his Heirs & Agents
for ever the Lot of Land lying in Talquer County which I purchased
John Dear Junr. and all the Stock & household furniture which was on the
said Lot consisting of one Bed Two Potts & a Dutch oven. ten bush of Hop
and also a Sorel House.

Item. I give & bequeath to my son Aquila. Matthews his Heirs & Agents
forever One hundred and thirty Acres of Land binding on barnsides
being part of my land in Calipper where I now live. One yearling
Mare bott.

Item I give & Bequeath to my Son William. Matthews his Heirs & Agents
for ever one Lot of Land in the Town of Gaiper. A "37 a Calipper
Court House. And a Desk & Bed base. One Black Mare & one Bed
and Furniture. one pot. one Dish. two plates. & a half dozen or so

Item I give to my son Elisha. Matthews his Heirs & Agents for ever an
hundred and ten Acres of Land joining John Dear lines. Of this
Shilmans. one Bed & Furniture one Horse & eight pounds each to the
one.

Item I give to my Son Daniel. Matthews his Heirs & Agents for ever all
the Remainder of that Tract which is over & above what I have given
her Brothers Benjamin. Aquila. & Elisha. Matthews and one Horse
or Eight Pounds Cash to Buoyone. One Cow & half of one Bed & Furni-

Item I give to my Son James Matthews Fifty Pounds Cash & one Hous
or Eight Pounds more to by one to him his Heirs & Assigns forever to be
paid to him out of my Estate when he arrives to the age of twenty one years.

Item I give to my Daughter Franky, ^{Matthew} Ten Pounds Cash & one Leather
Bed & Furniture to the worth of Ten Pounds more to her, her Heirs & Assigns
forever to be paid her at eighteen years of Age, or at the day of Marriage.

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary Matthews Ten Pounds Cash
for Leather Bed to the value of Ten Pounds to her, her Heirs & Assigns forever
to be paid her at the age of eighteen or marriage day.

Item I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Ann Matthews all the rest
of my estate & all the tract of Land where I now live (except the Hundred
of acres I have given to my son Benjamin) which he is to have possession of
upon my death after my decease, but the rest of Land to remain in my wife's
possession during her life or widowhood.

Justly I do make & constitute, Culbitt Bullock and my Son
John Matthews & and my wife Ann Matthews Executors & Executrix of
this my Last will & Testament disannulling & making void all other wills
by me made from the beginning of the world to the day of his Date hereof.

and Parish of St Mark being well & understanding my last Will &
Testament in manner and memory do ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner
following, to wit, first I give my soul into the hands of almighty god
that gave it me and my Body to the Earth to be decently buried by the
discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and my worldly Estate in
manner following Vizt. When my Daughter Kennisha was married
Sister Yancey Jun^t I lent her a Negro man named Sharper, now
I give the said Negro man Sharper to her and her Heirs forever and
five pounds cash after my Wifes death to be paid her by my Executors

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My Will and desire is that all my negroes and other Estate as it now
is remain together so long as my wife lives for the use and benefit of
Maintaining my said Wife Isabell Faver, the Children of my son
William Faver deceased And their mother so long as she continues a
Widow. And after my wifes death I lend to my son John Faver Dinah
a Negro Woman and three Children named Rose, Judy and
Spencer, during his life and his present wifes widowhood at the Expira-
tion of which time I give the said negro Woman Dinah and her
three children Rose, Judy & Spencer and all their Increase from
this date 1779 to the ~~children~~ of John Faver by Ann his present
Wife Daughter of Thomas Covington and Gael his Wife - I give to my
grand Daughter Isabell Faver daughter of my son William Faver a
Negro Girl named Pendon to her and her Heirs forever but Should
she die before marriage her Sister Alice shall be her Heir. I lend a
Negro Girl named Rachel about twelve years old to help to maintain
the Children of William Faver until the youngest Child Rosanna be
Eight Years old then after the death of my wife I give the said negro girl
Rachel and her Increase to be divided amongst the Children of John Faver
by Ann his wife to them and their Heirs forever. After the death of my
wife I give Five hundred and twenty five Acres of Land I now possess
with all the houses and all that contain thereon with the remainder of
all my Estate to be Equally divided amongst the Children of William Faver
or the Survivors of them their names are, Alice Faver, Henrietta Faver, Isabell
Faver, Frances Faver & Rosanna Faver to them and their Heirs forever. My
Will and desire is that my negro man Adam shall live with the Children
& Widow until they all come of age. Then he shall choose his Mistress out of
the five Girls or the Survivors of them and whatever he may be
Valued at by my Executors shall be Equally divided among
the five Girls or the Survivors of them to be paid by which ever he
chooses for his Mistress to them and their Heirs forever. And lastly
my Will and desire is that the Widow of my Son William Faver
shall live with the Children on the Land and Plantation during her

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Widowhood — I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Burkett Davenport and John Williams Executors of this my last Will and Testament revoking all others heretofore by me made, in Testimony of which I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 19th day of July 1779


