Item, I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Ruben Thomas & his heirs forever the bed and furniture I make use of myself to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson John Thomas son of Mafsey Thomas my other bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever also I give in like manner to the said John Thomas my Grandson one warming pan one spice mortar one skillet one Dutch oven one Iron spitt of about twelve Gallons and hooks and one box Iron.

Item. It is my will and desire that my old negro woman Jude (being the first negro I possessed and now too old and infirm for Labour) may not be disturbed or compelled to service but remain free and unmolested the remainder of her life.

Item it is my will and desire that the residue of my Estate not already given away or heretofore mentioned may be disposed of at the Highest bidder and the Cash arising therefrom after the payment of my Just debts be divided among my following children, viz. Benjamin, John, & the representatives of Mafsey, William, Robert McKoy, who married my daughter Margaret, William Powell who married my daughter Sarah, Jeremiah Heck who married my daughter Ann or their heirs or assigns by equal distribution.

I constitute and appoint my son John Thomas, my Grandson John Thomas son of Mafsey and William Wallace Executors to this my last will and testament.

And Lastly I revoke, declare void and of no effect all former wills by me made and do declare this to be my last will and Testament the word (or) being interlined on second side before signing Witness my hand this twenty ninth day of April - one thousand seven hundred and eighty two -

Thomas's Will

Will

In the Name of God Amen I Christopher Thomas of the County of Culpeper & Colony of Virginia being of perfect sense & memory & duly weighing the uncertainty of Human affairs, do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner following Inprimis I give my Immortal part to the Divine Author of my Body to the death to be interred in such decent sort as my Executors hereafter named shall think fit.

First. I give & bequeath to my reputed son of whom I have raised from his Infancy William Sherul son of Margaret Sherul Alias Margery Parkins all that tract or parcel of Land which I purchased of John Latham lying on the aforesaid County it being the same on which I now live to him & his Heirs or Assigns for ever. Also I give to my said son one seventh part of all my Negroes, & Cattle & Hogs which I give & bequeath to him my said son William Sherul to him his Heirs & Assigns for ever.

Secondly I give & bequeath to my reputed son Thomas Freeman son of Elizabeth Freeman who now lives with me, one half of those two Tracts of Land which I purchased of Humphrey Wallace & Robert Eastham situate in the County aforesaid to include in his part the plantation where Isaac Anderson formerly lived Also one seventh part of all my Slaves, and Stock of all kinds, and Household furniture which I give to my said son Thomas Freeman his heirs or Assigns forever

Thirdly I give to my reputed son George son of Elizabeth Freeman aforesaid the other half of my said two tracts of Land purchased of Wallace of Eastham as aforesaid to include in his part the plantation where William Sherill now lives, but if in case the said George Freeman should die without Lawful Issue then I give the said Land to my son Thomas Freeman aforesaid to him his Heirs & Assigns forever. Also I Give & bequeath to my said son George Freeman one seventh part of all my Slaves & Stocks of all kinds & Household furniture to him his heirs & assigns forever.

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my reputed daughter Ann Spelman wife of Nathaniel Spelman one seventh part of all my Slaves except Twenty five pounds which she has already received in an old Negro man, which twenty five pounds is to be accounted in her proportion of the said Slaves which I give to her & her Heirs & Assigns forever.

Fifthly I lend to my reputed daughter Sarah Anderson the wife of Isaac Anderson one Fourteenth part of all my Slaves during her natural life, and after her death. If she leaves any lawful Heir or Heirs begotten of her Body then I give & bequeath the said Fourteenth part of my Slaves to be equally divided amongst her lawful Children, but if she dies Sarah Anderson should die leaving no lawful Child then the said fourteenth part of my Slaves shall be equally divided amongst my several reputed Sons & Daughters or their Representatives.

Sixthly I give & bequeath to my reputed daughter Elizabeth Garner the wife of Jonas Garner, one Fourteenth part of all my Slaves to her & her Heirs and Assigns forever.

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my reputed Daughter Mary Freeman Daughter of Elizabeth Freeman whom now lives with me one Seventh part of all my Slaves & Stocks of all kinds & Household furniture which I give to her & her Heirs & Assigns forever.

Eighthly I give and bequeath to my reputed daughter Frances Freeman daughter of Elizabeth Freeman aforesaid one seventh part of all my Slaves & Stock of all kinds & Household Furniture to her & her Heirs & Assigns for ever.

Ninthly It is my Will and desire that all my Slaves be kept together & work on my plantation or Lands untill my Debts are paid. ~ ~ ~ ~ ~

Tenthly It is my Will & desire that whatever of my Slaves shall upon a Distribution be allotted to Thomas Freeman, George Freeman, Mary Freeman & Frances Freeman shall remain & be work'd upon the Tracts of Land herein before devised to the said George Freeman untill the death, Age, or Marriage of each of them respectively & that they during the same time shall each of them receive the profits arising from the Labours of their separate & distinct parts in such Slave or Slaves. ~ ~ ~ ~ ~

Eleventh It is my will & desire that Elizabeth Freeman the mother of my Children aforesaid who now lives with me, have leave to continue with her children on the Land given to Thomas & George Freeman clear of Board for victuals & during the time she lives chaste & unmarried or untill the said George Freeman shall ^{come} of age or marriage. ~ ~ ~ ~ ~

Twelfth I give & bequeath to the said Elizabeth Freeman six pounds Current Money of Annam during the time she remains chaste & unmarried to be paid out of that part of my Estate devised to the said Thomas Freeman George Freeman, Mary Freeman & Frances Freeman to be paid by equal portions, but on her the said Elizabeth's incontinency or marriage the Annuity to subside. ~ ~ ~ ~ ~

Thirteenth It is my will & desire that my Tools & whatever else of my Estate which are to be found & is not already mentioned be equally divided amongst my several reputed Sons & Daughters & if any of them should die before they come to Age or Marry, then his, her, or their part to be & remain to the Survivors & their Representatives, I mean all Slaves & given to any one by this Will if they so die their part to be divided amongst the Survivors &c. ~ ~ ~ ~ ~

Lastly I do ordain & appoint my Friends Henry Pondleton, James Pondleton, John Wigginton & the said William Sherrill Executors to this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all wills by me
heretofore
