I John Calvert of the County of Culpeper and Commonwealth of Virginia being Sick in Body but of perfect sense and sound memory do declare this to contain my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth

Item, I give and bequeath the Land whereon I now live on to Helen Calvert my loving wife that is the one third part of Five hundred and fifty six acres including my dwelling house during her natural life and after her decease to my son Bealvis Calvert,

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Bealvis Calvert the remainder of the Tract of Land whereon I now live that is the other two thirds of the above said five hundred and fifty six acres to him and his Heirs forever,

Item I give and bequeath the Land formerly belonging to my father whereon his widow now lives containing Three hundred and forty three acres to my daughter that is to say Sarah Calvert and Anna Calvert to be equally divided between them to them & their Heirs forever.

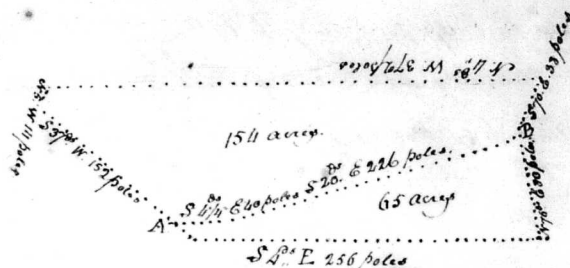
