Item I give to my daughter Polly Harrison Wark wife of John Wark all that I formerly lent her and in her possession to her and her heirs forever -

Item The whole residue and remainder of my Estate both real and personal, to wit the land & plantation whereon I now live also all my household and Kitchen Furniture and Plantation Tools, and stock of every kind except such of my Stock and Furniture as I have already mentioned, also the following negroes.
