Christ to receive full Remission and forgiveness of all my sins and
my Body I commit to the earth to be decently Buried at the
Discretion of my Executors hereafter named. I give unto
my beloved wife Elizabeth the one third part of my Estate and the
rest of my Estate to be equally Divided among my Children
And lastly I do make and Ordain my beloved son John Wayland
And Godfrey Yeager Executors of this my last Will and Testament
Revoking all other Wills by me made and Intestments that this
my last Will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this Sixteenth day of May A.D. 1800 Thousand Seven hundred

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Discretion of my Executors hereafter named. I give unto
my beloved wife Elizabeth the one third part of my Estate and the
rest of my Estate to be equally Divided among my Children
And lastly I do make and Ordain my beloved son John Wayland
And Godfrey Yeager Executors of this my last Will and Testament
Revoking all other Wills by me made and Intending that this be
my last Will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this sixteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and seventy five.
