In the name of God Amen I Alexander M^r Queen being very aged
and infirm calling to mind the uncertainty of all things on this earth and
not knowing how soon it may please God to take me out of this world do
make this my last Will and Testament revoking and annulling all
others heretofore by me made. I give and bequeath my soul
back to God who gave it hoping that by the Intercession and Mercy of
our Lord Jesus Christ to have it again joined to my Body at the

Resurrection and with it enjoy Eternal Felicity and my Body I leave to
be decently Buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named
and as to what Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with (after paying
my Just Debts I give and bequeath in manner and form following to wit
Item I lend to Henrietta Cooper (alias W^o Queen) with whom I am Inter-
married all my estate both Real and Personal during her natural life
and at her decease my will is that she shall have full power to will and
and make such distribution of it among the Children that I have had
by her and by my former ~~1776~~ ¹⁷⁹³ she shall think Just and right except
the Legacies hereafter named

Item I give to my son John W^o Queen one pound as his proportion of my said
Estate I have given him a Tract of Land and other things before and my
Will is that he receive no part or parcel thereof but the said one pound

Charles W^o Queen's son I had by her an Executor to this my last Will
and Testament revoking all others whatsoever I Witness whereof I have
