this Seventh day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Fifty four
make and Publish this my last will and Testament in the presence of my friends
I will that my wife Jane Tull shall have and Enjoy for and During her Natural life all
my land and Plantation whereon I now live One Negro Boy named Tom, and all the rest

residue of my Estate whatsoever, upon Condition that she shall not marry
 nor leave the Plantation whereon I am here to live with any Strangers or other person
 whatsoever and from & in case of her Death a Marriage or removal out of
 the said my will I give to my Son Samuel with all my said ^{and all my Books} and Plantation of my own
 to hold to him and his heirs forever also from & after the Decease of my said wife her Marriage
 is removal contrary to this my will I give to my Daughter Frances the wife of Abraham
 Cooper the Negro Boy Tom of my own will to hold to her and her heirs forever, and as
 my will is that if the said Negro shall live till my said Daughter shall be free of
 herself by Virtue of this my will that then she shall have I give to my said Daughter
 Frances all the Debt & residue of my Personal Estate whatsoever from & after the
 Decease of my wife or her Marriage or removal contrary to this my will
 but in case the Negro Boy of my own will shall live till my said Daughter shall
 be free of him then and in such case I will that all the real & Personal
 Personal Estate whatsoever shall be equally divided among all my Children
 then living, I also give to my Daughter Elizabeth Cather One Shilling and
 my Daughter Ann Cather One Shilling and lastly I make and Ordain
 my wife Jane Scott Executor and my Son Samuel Scott Executor of the

my daughter Ann whom I have married and my wife Jane Scott Executor and my son Samuel Scott Executor of the will In Witness whereof I the said Anthony Scott have to this my will & Testament set my hand & seal the Day and Year above Written
