of twenty pounds and if in case my Negroe man Tom should die

Daughter Anne Barbara is to fall short fifteen pounds.

And it is my will and Desire that all the Remainder of my Personal
Estate be equally Divided between my beloved wife Anne Margaret
and my beloved Daughter Anne Barbara and my beloved Daughter

Elizabeth forty days after my Decease
