At a Court held for Culpeper County the 20<sup>th</sup> Day Jan<sup>y</sup> 1783

This Last Will and Testament of Barnard Roger Dec<sup>d</sup> was Exhibited to the Court and by the Oath of James Seber Witness thereto who also swore that he saw the Testator Write the said Will with his own hand

Whereupon it is ordered to be Recorded

And at a Court held for the said County 17<sup>th</sup> Day of March 1783

Ambrose Medley one of the Executors therein named came into Court

and made Oath thereto and gave Bond and Security according to Law

and on his Motion Certificate is granted him for a probate thereof in due

form Liberty being Reserved for the two other Executors to Qualify when

they think fit
