my Estate real and personal except my Smiths Tools and Gun & if she marries
to Enjoy only one third part of my Estate for & During her natural life
& the other two thirds to be lodged in the hands of my two sons John Long
& Bromfield Longs to maintain and Educate my children out of the
profits of the same in the best manner they can and at the Death of

my beloved wife Sarah Long if my son Thomas Long should be of Lawfull
Age I desire that my whole Estate real and personal except as before Excepted
be sold for the best price and Equally Divided Amongst my Children
Reuben Long John Long Bromfield Long Gabriel Long Thomas Long Mary
Chusam Betty Long Milly Long & my son Benjamin Longs son Benjamin
to them and their heirs forever Taking care to Deduct out of my sons
Reuben Longs part Fifty pounds & out of my Daughter Marys Children

Part Thirty pounds they having already received a part of my Estate
If my son Thomas should not be of Lawfull age at the Death of my
wife I desire that the whole of my Estate (except as before Excepted) be con-
tinued in the hands of my sons John and Bromfield Longs to be kept
together till he does arrive to the age of Twenty one years and then
sold and Divided as above

Item I give unto my son Bromfield ^{Long} all my Smaller Tools & Guns

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Lastly I constitute and appoint my Trusty and well beloved sons
John Long & Bromfield Longs Executors to this my Last Will and
Testament hereby Revoking and Disannulling all former Wills or
Wills by me made in Testimony of the above I have hereunto set
