Motion of Sarah Long Widow of the said Deceased Certificate is granted
her for Obtaining Letters of Administration with the will annexed
till the Executors Qualify she having made Oath thereto and given
bond and Security According to Law

In the name of God Amen I Conwright Walter of S. Marks
in Culpeper County being Verry sick and weak but of sound and
perfect mind and Memory thanks be to God do hereby make my Last
will and Testament that is to say briefly and Principally I

Recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my Body to
 to the earth to be buried in christianian like and Decent manner and
 as Touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless
 me with in this life I give Devote and Dispose of in the following
 manner & form I mp^t I give unto my loving wife all that I am possessed
 with in this world during her life only one young horse and that
 I give unto my son Frederick and if either of my Daughters that is
 now living with me should die and leave their Mother I desire
 they may have a bed and cow and calf if it can be spared and after
 my wifes Decease I give the tract of land now live on containing
 Two hundred and eighty acres more or less unto my son Frederick
 and he must pay his brother William forty pounds and if after my
 wifes Decease there is four Negroes I give them unto my four Youngest
 Daughters the Eldest Taking her first choice and if there is not so many
 I desire they may be divided equally among my four Youngest Daughters
 and if there should be more than four Negroes at my wifes Decease

then my four youngest Daughters to have their choice of their four
and the rest to be equally divided amongst my Children that I had by
my last wife and I do give unto my Daughter Barbary Sackett Five
pounds after my wifes Decease and as to what other Estate there is at
my wifes Decease I desire it may be equally divided amongst my
last wifes children and I do appoint my son William Thabler and
William Collins Executors of this last Will and Testament Revoking
all other will or Wills by me heretofore made and do Declare this
and no other to be my Will and Testament In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal this Twentieth day of November
in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and seventy
seven
