 do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following
 Viz I bequeath my Precious and Immortal soul to Almighty God who gave
 it in full hope of Pardon and Remission of all my sins and Transgressi-
 ons thro the Merits and Mediation of my Blefied Savior and Redeemer
 Jesus Christ my Body to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my
 Executor hereafter named and as to such worldly Estate wherewith
 it hath Pleased God to bless me with I Dispose of the same as followeth
 Viz

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I give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Mary Fogg the
 sum of Five shillings current money of Virginia to her and her
 Heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my Grandson Mitchell Barts the sum of
 Five shillings current money of Virginia to him & Heirs forever -

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Fanny Mitchell
the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds current Money of Virginia
to be Raised out of my Estate and left in the hands of Executors to
be paid on terms of Marriage or at the age of Eighteen years -

Item I give all the rest of my Estate Really and Personally to my Dutifull and
well beloved wife Jane Mitchell to her and her heirs forever -

Lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my Dear and Loving wife Jane
Mitchell and my faithful and true Friend William Roberts Executors
and Executors to this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking all
former Wills by me made and Declaring this to be my Last will and
Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed
my seal this Twenty seventh day of November 1778
