have thought proper to constitute and makes this my last will and Testament
in manner and form following Renouncing all and Every will heretofore
made by me viz

I give my soul to my God who gave it hoping that it will remaine
Happy in y^e hand of my Saviour till y^e day of Judgment when soul
and Body be joined together to Praise him forever

My Desier is that my Body may be Buried according to y^e Directions
of my Executor hereafter named & after my Just Debts with my Funeral
Expences are paid my Desier is that what it has Pleas'd God to Bless
me with of this world's Goods may be Given as followeth Viz I give &
bequeath to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Marshall Daughter to
my son Thomas Marshall one Negroe boy named David I Give
and bequeath to my Grandson Lewis Marshall some to son William
Marshall one Negroe boy named Peggy on Condition that the first
child she Bares after my Death that comes to be five years old be
Given to my Grandson George Marshall each to be possessor of there
Respective Legacies at y^e age of Twenty one or at y^e day of Marriage
or if other shall Die the Survivor to possess the whole and My will
is that my son William Marshall my Possessor y^e said Negroes &
Increase till my said Grandsons come of age at years old
I Give and bequeath to my Grandson Thomas Marshall son of
In^c Marshall one Negroe Boy nam'd Jerry. I Give and bequeath

I give and bequeath to my Grandson Thomas Smith one Negro woman named Bet to him and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my Grandson Wm Lovett one Negro boy named Abraham to him & his heirs forever. I give to my Daughter Mary McLanahan my Sorell Mare and Fono horse also sixty pounds cash.

I give to my son Markham Marshall one Negro Man named Joe one Feather bed and ^{Culpeper County, Virginia Wills} ~~furniture~~ ¹⁷⁷⁶⁻¹⁷⁸³ and one half of my Stock of Cattle Sheep hogs &c to him and his heirs forever.

I give to my Daughter Margaret Snelling if Remainder half of my Stock hogs cattle &c with if Remainder of my Household Furniture I give to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Snelling one Negro boy named George forever.

And my Will is that my son William Marshall shall have all my Possession with my Tools of every kind, and if money my can sell for with all if Debts Due to me after paying my Daughters

~~Give and bequeath to my Grandson Wm~~
I give one Negro boy named Abraham to him & his heirs forever
I give to my Daughter Mary McLanahan my small mare and some horse
also sixty pounds Cash

Now I give to my son Nathaniel Marshall one Negro Man named
Joe one Feather bed and furniture and one half of my stock of Cattle
Sheep hogs &c to him and his heirs forever

Now I give to my Daughter Margaret Snelling of Remains half
of my stock hogs cattle &c with of Remains of my Household Furniture
Now I give to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Snelling one Negro boy
named George forever

And my Will is that my son William Marshall shall have all
my Possession with my Tools of every kind, and if money my Cattle
sells for with all of Debts due to me after paying my Daughters
money McLanahan sixty pounds with my Debt and Funeral
Expenses &c

Lastly I appoint my sons William Marshall and Markham Marshall
my Executors of this of this my last Will & Testament in Token hereof I
have set my hand and seal this 17th April 1779
