In the name of God Amen I Elliott Bohannon of Culpeper

County calling to mind the certainty of Death and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make constitute and appoint this my last Will and Testament revoking all other wills or wills heretofore

made and first I give my body to the ground to be buried at the discretion of my Executors in a christian like manner

I stand and bequeath unto my beloved wife Ann Bohannon three negroes

which is to say, Jacob Ben Selvey and her children and one third part of my stock and household furniture during her natural life or Widowhood, and to be subject to an Equal division after her death

I give unto my son Ambrose Bohannon the Tract of Land whereon I now live to him and his Heirs forever Likewise Two Negroes named George and Rachael

I Give unto my three Daughters Mildret Gainer, Mary Herndon and Anne Worley Fifty pounds hard Cash or the Depreciation in Paper Money to be raised out of my Estate

5th My will and desire is that all my debts should be paid and the ballance of my estate sold at public Auction and the money arising from the said Estate to be Equally divided among my eight Children

Lastly I appoint ~~my son~~ ^{James} Bohannon, John Bohannon and Elliott Bohannon Executors to this my last Will and Testament
