to him by my Executors Joining his Land & Henry Millars at the
River above my plantation which I give to him & his heirs forever

Item my will is that my son Jacob Haines pay my Daughter

Sarah Painter five hundred in Gold or Silver & Twenty pounds of like
money to my Grandson Abraham Haines when he arrives to the age
of Twenty one years and to enable my son Jacob to pay the above
Legacies I give to him and his Heirs forever all the Remainders of
the Tract of Land I live on that is not already given with the
Plantation and Improvements
