Francis Fletcher being sick of Body but thanks be to God in my perfect
sense and sound memory and after all my Just Debts and Funerals be-
paid my will and pleasure is the rest of my Estate to be disposed of as followeth.

Viz.
I give and bequeath to my well be loved Wife Nanny Fletcher the
(Daughter of Thomas Lockins, the whole of my Estate Real & Personal
during her natural life or ~~Marriage~~ and after her death or Marriage
the Negroes to be hired out till the Children comes of age and the money
put out on Interest. the negroes names as followeth, viz Phillis Sam. Major
and Charles and the Increase of the said Phillis to be disposed of in like
Manner and when the Children come to age the negroes to be sold and
the money to be Equally divided amongst my well beloved Children as followeth
Jenny, Jerry, White, Anne White, Billy and Sukey the disposal of which
Estate to be left to Thomas Allen and Daniel Field Executors, Given under
my hand and seal the day and Date above Written
