This Last will and Testament of George Brown Decedent was
 exhibited to court by Lucy Brown and James Bindleton two of the
 Executors therein named and was proved by the oaths of the Witnesses
 thereto and Ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Execs
 Certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form
 they having made oath thereto and given bond and Security according
 to Law being reserved for the other Executors to Join in the Probate
 when they shall think fit. Lucy Brown Widow and Relict of
 of the said Decedent, is in court and refusing the Provision made
 for her in her said Husbands Will, and takes her Dower at
 Common Law
