

Doggett's Will - In the Name of God Amen I George Doggett of the
Parish of St Mark in the County of Culpeper being
Indisposed in Body but Thanks to God, of a sound
mind & memory as usual, and knowing the uncertainty
of this Life Do make & ordain my last Will & Last
in Manner & form following (to wit)

Principally I wish I recommend my Soul to Allm
God, Humbly hoping through the Merits of Jesus Christ
to Obtain Pardon & Remission of all my sins & to
everlasting Felicity; And my Body I can will
the Earth (from whence it came) thereon to be decently
Interred in a Christian like manner & unto
worldly Estate with which it hath Pleased God
to bless me I dispose of as follows (viz)

I Give & Bequeath to my son Chatwin Doggett
Heirs and Assigns forever one Tract of Land containing
one hundred & thirty four Acres lying in Lancaster
as also one negro Boy Named Daniel But it is
Will that in Case my said son Chatwin should Die
before he arrives at the Age of twenty one years I was Do

The Earth (from whence it came) and
Interred in a Christian like manner and
worldly Estate with which it hath Pleased God
me I dispose of as follows (viz)

I Give & Bequeath to my son Chaswin Doggett
Heirs and Assigns forever one Tract of Land containing
one hundred & Sixty four Acres Lying in Lancaster
as also one negro Boy Named Daniel But it is
Will that in Case my said son Chaswin should Die before
he arrives at Lawfull Age without Issue of his Body
then the said Land shall go to my son Thomas Doggett
and his Heirs and Assigns forever

I Give to my son Thomas Doggett one Negro Boy
Harry
I Give to my Daughters Sarah Ann Reynolds and
Margaret Scroggin each the sum of ten Shillings
And all the remainder of my Estate after my Funerals
Charges & just Debts are paid I lend to my Beloved
Wife Ann Doggett during her natural Life and
after

87) after her decease to be equally Divided between all my
Children, except Sarah Ann Reynolds & Margaret Snodgrass
aforesaid who I do not intend shall have any more of my
Estate than what they have already received & the ten
shillings each above mentioned; It is my Will and Desire
that my Estate shall not be Appraised

Lastly I do hereby Nominate, Constitute & appoint my
Beloved Wife Ann Doggett Executrix & my son Thomas
Doggett Executor of this my last Will & Testament I do hereby
revoke all former Wills by me made & do declare this
only to be my last Will & Testament, In Testimony whereof
I do hereunto set my Hand & Seal this 6th Day of
January in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred
