

Mathew Will I George Withersall being sick and in a low condition do make my last Will and Testament as follows (to wit) I having given to my Daughter Fowles two Reasonable Negroes a Bed & furniture a beast and Saddle and other things beside the before mentioned Articles which I think was worth Ten pounds hard money I give and confirm the same to her & her Heirs forever I Item I empower and require my Executors hereafter mentioned to make of all or any part of my estate except the Two hundred acres of Land whereon my Dwelling house stands ^{Culpeper County, Virginia Wills} ¹⁷⁴⁰⁻¹⁷⁸³ ^{www.virginiapioneers.net} and the money or so much arising from the said sales to be laid out in slave or slaves as they shall think the estate will bear so as they may Deliver to all or each of my Daughters on Marriage or as soon after as may be two Reasonable one (Bed & furniture a Beast and saddle and other convenient Articles to the amount of Ten pounds hard Cash the same as my Daughter Fowles had I Item I having given unto my daughter Anne my negro head young mare and saddle and harness with I confirm the same to her as part of what she is to have at or about the time of Marriage I Item I having given to my Daughter Mary one negro Girl named

hounds must have the same as my daughter's hounds

Item I having given unto my daughter Anne my negro ~~girl~~ young
mare and saddle and having what I perform the same to her in part
of what she is to have at or about the time of Marriage

Item I having given to my daughter Mary one negro girl named
Loy black mare and having what I perform the same to her in part
of what she is to receive at or about the time of marriage

Item I give unto my son John my great Bible that was my fathers which
is now at Mr. Longs also the same that was my fathers

Item the Residue of my estate to be kept together during my wife's natural
life or marriage for the support of her my son John and my unmarried
Daughters but in case she marry I give her all the part of my estate and the
the land whereon my Dwelling house stands before mentioned which
said land at my wife's Death or Marriage I give to my son John or also
one reasonable negro and one horse and saddle

Item the Residue of my estate (if any) to be equally divided amongst all
my children

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Lastly I constitute and appoint my loving friends Robert Shotwell^{3rd} Henry Towles and Henry Hill Executors of this my last Will and Testament Inttestness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Thirteenth day of June 1781
