Nacey Tureman my whole Estate Except the third I Mend to
my loving wife to be Equally divided between them Except

My wife should be with Child if so and should be a son I leave
 him my land whereon I now live and an equal share of the rest
 of my estate if a Daughter the three to have an equal share of
 my estate my land of four Hundred Acres lying in Kentucky
 to be sold and equally divided between my children to them
 and their Heirs forever

I constitute and appoint my wife and Jacob Medley & Ambrose
 Medley Executors of this my last Will & Testament In Witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty
 eighth of March One Thousand seven Hundred and Eighty one
