I James Allan of the County of Culpeper and Parish of Saint Marks and Colony of Virginia being Sick & Weak but of perfect Mind and Memory Thanks be to God for it Calling to mind the uncertainty of this life that it is Appointed for all Men once to die I Do Appoint & make this my last Will and Testament and None other.

First I bequeath my Soul to Almighty God my Maker and to Jesus Christ my Redeemer and to the Holy Ghost my Sanctifier and my Body to the Earth from whence it came, to be buried in such Decent manner and Christian form as to my Executors shall be Thought meet and Convenient there to rest Untill my Soul and body meet together at the glorious Morning of the Resurrection.

Item I Give to my well beloved Wife Mary all that I wholly and solely possess During her Widowhood But if she Chances to Marry then only her thirds.

Item

I then I give and bequeath to my well beloved Son William two Hundred and five Acres of Land when he arrives at the Age of twenty one years Living and being in the Main fork of Appahannock in the aforesaid County Adjoining to the Land of Thomas Wake and to the Land of Stuffy Limberman to the Land of Bryan Thornhill and to the Land of Charles Morgan to him and his Heirs For ever But in Case my Son William Dies without Heir my will and Desire is that it may fall to my Daughter Elizabeth Allen to Her and her Heirs For Ever.

I then I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth all the Movables I wholly and solely possess with I believe about the Quantity of forty barrils of Corn to be turned into to her and her Heirs forever But in Case my Daughter Elizabeth Dies without Heir my will and Desire is that it may fall To my Son William and his Heirs for Ever.

I then But in Case both my Children viz William and Elizabeth should die without Heir My will and Desire is that the Land I left to my Son William may fall to William Allen to him and his Heirs for Ever But

William Allan to him and his Heirs for Ever & but
he dies without Heir then my Will and Desire is the
land shoud be sold and turned into Money and
Equally Divided between my three Sisters Viz Ann
Martha and Elizabeth

Item my Will and Desire is that if both my Children
 William Allan and Elizabeth should Die without Heirs
 my Desire is that William Stamps Jun^r should poss^s
 Wholly and Solely that is every thing I left to my
 Elizabeth
 Now I commend my Dear wife and Well

Elizabeth Now I appoint My Dear wife and William
Stamps Jr and William Tackett to be Executors of the
my last will as Witness my Hand this 14th day of August
