Will in the County of Culpeper in Virginia being called on to serve a Term in the
Militia and considering the uncertainty of worldly affairs do make and
Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following, Viz
I give all my whole estate Real and Personal to my loving wife Lavinia
Hunt and to her disposal except she should have an Heir by me and then
in such case the whole to Lavinia in her possession till she either dies or
Marries and in case she should have an Heir by me and afterwards
Marry then the whole to be equally divided between her and the said Heir
And I do hereby constitute and appoint her father Richard Gaines and
my Brother William Hunt Joint Executors of this my last Will and
Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this 10th day of September 1779 MDCCLXXIX
