Last Will and Testament, First I recommend my Soul to the hands of my
Gracious Creator trusting thro. the Merit of my dear Redeemer to be
partaker of everlasting felicity and my body to be buried at the discretion of my
Executors hereafter Named in this my said Will, And as for what
Temporal it hath pleased God to bestow on me I bequeath them in
manner following

Item I give and bequeath to my Son James P. H. H. all the tract of land
whereon he now lives to him and his heirs forever fully enjoying to him and his
heirs the same during his life and the life of his heirs

306 Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Son James T. H. H. and
to his heirs forever the following Slaves to wit Francis and N. with
their two negro children now to wit Sylvia & Paul on born of the said Negro
Woman after being in his Possession, also one negro and London
which he purchased of me for the consideration of forty pounds
but money which I acknowledge to have received all which Slaves
are now in his Possession, also I give to my said Son James one
of a set, one strong Negro two beds & furniture, and other Linnen &c.
to the Value of Five Pounds, I having before made them and all
what I said intended him.

Item 3 Wherein the Lands of John Floyd & John Coleman over near
Run above the Lands of Mr Ambrose and formerly Thomas and ad-
my tract of Land called Little Run on the said Run was included in
my early survey by each of their Contents in the Reference
in the Northern Neck of Virginia and they having paid each
proportionable Expence of Office &c of My Will and I were in
Culpeper County, Virginia Wills 1769-1770
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Respect and parts of said Sullards tract be conveyed to them & to
each of them or his heirs the particular portions held by each
Person according to his intent & bound, by any her at Law or
Attorney in Fact.

I have I give and bequeath to my loving son Philip Sullard and his
heirs forever, all my Land lying on Mountain Run, Adjacent
the lands of May, Philip Clayton & Mr. Ambrose Campbell for
the same being by estimation nine hundred & fifty eight Acres
said known by the name of Toots and Sullards.

I have I give and bequeath to my son Philip and Negroe Slaves to wit to your
father's feather Beds & furniture & also three
sows & Pigs also Twenty Pound current money when he arrives to
Lawfull age or Day of Marriage.

I have I give and bequeath to my loving Daughter Ann Sullard & her
heirs the following Slaves to wit, Milly, George & Henry also two feather
Beds & furniture & also three sows & Pigs also

I hereby bequeath and assign when she arrives to Lawfull
age of Marriage

I do hereby bequeath to my Loving wife Elizabeth Pendleton the following Estates
to wit Manor, Town, Boats & Cattle During her natural life
and after her decease to be equally divided between my four Children
to wit Henry, James, Philip & Anne with all my Stocks & Town Cattle
Hogs & Cattle & after paying the Legacies bequeathed before to my wife
with my household furniture & all other moveables
I give to my Loving wife Elizabeth Pendleton the same to have & to enjoy
Doll with all her future increase

I hereby bequeath that all my Estates & Goods & Cattle & Town Cattle
be divided between my Loving wife Elizabeth Pendleton & my
four Children Henry, James, Philip & Anne in equal parts
during their full age or Day of Marriage

And lastly I appoint my Loving wife Elizabeth Pendleton
Executrix together with my Loving Brother Edmund Pendleton the
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executed together with my Loving Brother Edward Pendleton and
my two sons Henry Pendleton & James Pendleton Executors of my
Last will and Testament I the said James Pendleton have in our
own hand and affixed my Seal this twentieth Day of December
the year of our Lord God one Thousand six hundred & seventy Two

was shewed to the Court by Henry Parson James Parson

Consent of the said Henry Parson to the said Decree
to be Recorded and on the Motion of the said Executors
granted them for Obtaining a Probate thereof in due form
Court to be and is given Bond & Security Accompanying
Liberty being reserved for the Executors to sue in the Court
when they shall think fit
