untill my son Thomas Stubblefield arrive to the age of Eighteen years & if
my wife should now be with child and the same should die then my
device is that the said child have an Equal proportion of my Estate with
my said son Thomas Stubblefield and my wife to receive a third part of
my Estate for and during her natural life & at her decease the same
to return to my children but if my wife should not be with child then
she to have and enjoy one half of my Estate for and During her natural
life and the same to return to my son Thomas Stubblefield

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through the Merits of Christ my dear saviour to receive perfect remission
of all my sins and what worldly Good it hath pleased God to bestow on
me I give and bequeath in the following manner.

Item I lend to my beloved wife Ann Stubblefield all my Estate Real & Personal
untill my son Thomas Stubblefield arrives to the age of Eighteen years & if
my wife should now be with child and the same should live then my
desire is that the said child have an Equal proportion of my Estate with
my said son Thomas Stubblefield and my wife to receive a third part of
my Estate for and during her Natural life & at her decease the same
to return to my children but if my wife should not be with child then
she to have and enjoy one half of my Estate for and During her natural
life and the same to return to my son Thomas Stubblefield
to him and his heirs forever Provided nothing is contained in this will
to prevent my beloved wife from the Enjoyment of my whole Estate
untill my son Thomas Stubblefield arrives to the age of Eighteen years
she providing for him as sufficient Maintenance and schooling

Out of the profits of the same

Item If my son Thomas Stubblefield should die before he arrive to the
 Enjoyment of the estate (at which time he has the disposal of it) & my wife
 should have no other child as above & my wife Ann Stubblefield should
 be living then the same to be delivered to her during her natural life & at
 her decease all my Estate to be Equally divided Between the children
 of my sister Ann Dixon to them and their heirs forever
