named Jigg Samson at my wifes Death him said Samson to her
and her Heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath to Heirs of my Daughter Martha Mowatt
Five Shillings Current money to be paid by my Executors to them

Heirs forever

Item my Will is that at my wife's Death the Balance of my Estate be
sold for Ready money without being appraised, then or at my Death &
the money arising from sale thereof to be Equally Divided soe as for
my sons John & Churchill Blakey Sarah Edinr Frances Birch & Elizabeth
Davys my Daughters each to have one fifth part to them & their Heirs
forever

Item I do hereby make & ordain constitute and Appointe my Son
John Blakey & Joel Early Executors of this my last Will & Testament
revoking all other wills by me made heretofore In Witness whereof I
have hereunto sett my hand and seal this 30th December One Thousand
seven hundred & Eighty one
