The last Will & Testament of John Bond of Culpeper County being now at this time in perfect health & soundness of mind & memory as followeth Viz³

I do recommend my soul to God Almighty hoping he will receive it in peace into life everlasting & forgive me my by past sins of which I heartily repent
Item I deliver up my Body to the Earth from whence I came
Item After all my Just Debts & funerall charges are paid I decree the remainder of my Estate to be disposed of as followeth Viz

I decree my Beloved Wife Mary & my son in law Benjamin Long be & take upon them to be Executor & Ex^{or} of this my last Will & Testament

Item I leave my beloved Wife Mary my whole Estate ^{Inter} Life (only as is hereafter reserved) but if she should ^{Mar} with any other person that then my Estate shall be taken out of her hands reserving her thirds & the other two parts

with any other person that then my will
out of her hands reserving her thirds & the other two
to be given to my Daughter Mary Long to her & her Heirs
forever.

Item I desire the Plantation whereon I now live to be
my dearly beloved wife Marys during life & afterwards
to my Daughter Mary & her Heirs forever.

Item I Give & bequie to my Grandson John Bond Long
son of Bloomfield Long & Elizabeth his Wife my Bed and
furniture whereon I now live but not to be delivered till
the said John Bond Long comes of Age.

Item I Give & Bequie to my Grandson Bloomfield Long
son of Benjamin Long & Mary his Wife my Rifle Gun
but not to be delivered till the said Bloomfield Long comes
of Age.

Item After the Death of my Beloved Wife Mary Bond my
desire is that my whole Personal Estate & all the Goods &
Chattels that she then is Possessed of shall be given to my
beloved Daughter Mary Long & her Heirs forever.
