and not knowing how short my life may be in this world I do make &
ordain this for my last will and Testament in manner and form following
(to wit) I resign my soul to Almighty God that gave it me and my Body to
the ground to be decently Buried in hopes of a joyful Resurrection to
Eternal life, and my Worldly Goods & Estate which it hath pleased the
Almighty to give me I leave to be divided & bestowed as followeth WIT,
I therefore First Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret after
paying my Just Debts and funeral Expences one half of my Estate of all
Kinds to her and her Heirs forever

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Item Secondly I give and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret the other half of my Estate to her and her Heirs forever and in case my said Daughter should die before she comes of Age or should have and Heir of her Body Lawfully Begotten my desire is that my wife should enjoy the whole of my Estate

And lastly I do appoint and constitute my worthy Friend Martin Kette to be Ex^r of this my Last Will and Testament hereby Revoking all other before by me made and acknowledge this to be my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this sixth day of Feb^r 1780
