In the name of God Amen I John Daniel Jacobus of the
Parish of Brumfield County of Culpeper and Colony of Virginia
being weak in Body yet through the Abundant Mercy & goodness
of God of a sound and perfect understanding and Memory do
Constitute this my last Will & Testament and desire it may be
received by all as such I pray is I most humbly bequeath my
Soul to God my maker beseeching his most gracious Acceptance
of

159. Of it thro' the all sufficient Merits and Mediation of my Most
Compassionate Redeemer Jesus Christ, who gave himself to bear the
penalty for my sins and is able to save to the uttermost all that come to
God by him being he ever liveth to make Intercession for them, and who
I trust will not reject me a returning penitent sinner; when I
come to him for Mercy, in this hope & confidence I render ^{up} my soul
with Comfort, humbly beseeching the most blessed and glorious
Trinity One God most Holy most merciful and Gracious to keep
me for the Time of my Dissolution and then to take me to himself
into that peace and Rest and incomparable felicity, which he has
prepared for all that Love and fear his holy Name. Amen blessed
be God Amen.

Item I leave the use of all my Estate Real and personal of what kind
or nature soever to my Dearly beloved Wife Anna Parbra for
and during her natural Life provided she never Marries but
continues a Widow, and after her decease (or if she should Marry) I give and leave
all my Estate as aforesaid (Excepting a Negro man slave named Jack) to be
equally divided between my five Children viz. Francis John, David, Elizabeth
and Anna Parbra to them and their Heirs forever provided and to multiply

and Anna Barbara to them and their heirs forever provided and it is my will
and desire that the Land whereon I live (after my Wife's death & Intima-
ring) be sold to the highest bidder (and the money arising or becoming thereon
to be equally divided between my five children aforesaid Provided neverthe-
less and it my Will & Request that if my loving son Francis should incline to
have the whole tract of Land containing three hundred Acres whereon I live
that then & in that Case I Will that he may provide that there be three honest
Neighbours Appointed by my hereafter mentioned Executors to Value the said
Three hundred Acres of Land in Curr^t Money & he pay his Brothers & Sisters
their proportion of what the said Land is Valued at. But if my said son
Francis should decline taking the said Land as aforesaid then & in that Case
I Will and Desire that my other loving sons John & Daniel (according to their
Birth right have the said privilege & Account with their Brothers & Sisters
for their proportion of the Value of the said Land

Item I Give and Bequeath to my loving Daughter (the being my
Youngest) Anna Barbara over and Above her share of all my other
Estate one Negro man Slave named Jack to her & her Heirs
forever

forever & Lastly I constitute and Appoint my dearly
beloved Wife my well beloved son Fran^s and
well beloved friends John Brother Gent Executors of this
my last Will and Testament

last Will & Testament & that he saw the Witnesses there

And At a Court held for the said County on Thursday
21st day of April 1768 James McDonald made oath
he saw the said Decedent sign Seal and Publish
his last Will and Testament and that he saw his
Wife Sarah subscribe as a Witness to the same.

Ordered to be Recorded and at a Court held for the
said County on Thursday the 19th day of May 1768
John Francis Lucas Justice and John Strother Gent. Two of
the Executors therein named came into Court and
on their motion Certificate is granted them for obtaining
a Probat thereof in due form they having sworn to
the same and given Bond and Security according
to Law. Liberty being reserved for the other Exor^s
to join in the Probat when she thinks fit.
