what kind soever (after my just Debts are paid) to her & her heirs forever

Item. My desire is after the decease of my said Wife that the said Land be sold by
a Justicial Appointment & her heirs untill my son or his heirs Lawfully
& legally claim the same;

Item. I Will that my Estate be not Appraised
but I hereby constitute & Appoint my loving Wife my whole
Executor of this my last Will & Testament & Witnesses whereof
I have set my hand & seal this 21st day of March 1770
